Warning over postal scam

The Trading Standards Office are making people aware of the following scam:

A card is posted through your door from a company called PDS (Parcel Delivery Service) suggesting that they were unable to deliver a parcel and that you need to contact them on 0906 6611911 (a Premium rate number).

DO NOT call this number, as this is a

mail scam originating from Belize. If you call the number and you start to hear a recorded message you will already have been billed £315 for the phone call.

If you do receive a card with these details, then please contact Royal Mail Fraud on 020 7239 6655.

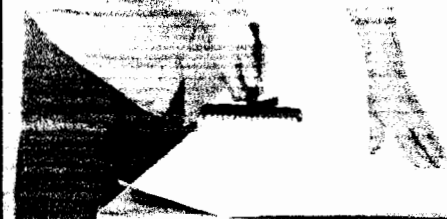

Parish council latest

Extracts from the minutes of a meeting held on Wednesday 14 September 2011:

CLERK'S REPORT ON ONGOING ISSUES

A: Former school house condition- Mr Steven Devey from ERYC attended this council meeting to explain and update ERYC actions so far and a letter from the homeowner Mr David Britton was cascaded to all councillors explaining the current situation from his point of view also. It was resolved that the councillors are updated on ERYC progress/actions regularly and provided with a timescale of events and given regular feedback.

B: Village entrance sign - Alex Wells from ERYC has been sent images of the village clock tower and Percy coat of arms to design an appropriate entrance sign. It was resolved that the council await the new sign design from ERYC.

C: Unadopted paths - the chairman reported that several councillors met with ERYC for a site visit to the public right of way path concerned. ERYC are to establish land owners details and advertise the right of way claim and clarify legal status. It was resolved to wait for updates on progress from ERYC.

D: The grass cutting areas in the village were established with a map provided of areas cut by ERYC and a time frame of cuts performed. It was resolved that the clerk will contact ERYC to request that grass cutting is continued from Wood View up to Bracken Hill along the verges.

E: Tree survey - Cllr Cowling met up with Michael Brown from ERYC recently to view and survey the village trees. It was resolved that the council wait for the tree report from ERYC.

F: Rusholme windfarm grant application - noted that funds are now available to apply for. It was resolved that the clerk will write to all community groups in the village to establish any requirements they may wish to apply for via this grant funding through the parish council.

G: North Airmyn Grange - the clerk notified of a letter received from ERYC stating that the bus company has now moved from these premises. It was resolved that the clerk raises concerns still of pallet storage, heights and lack of landscaping.

H: Flooding/drainage problems - Cllr Fox informed of a recent visit of Michael Clarke from ERYC to look at the drainage

problems in the village on 15/8/11. A detailed response has now been received identifying areas of concern and listing appropriate action to take. Thanks are to be minuted to Mr Thurlow for his prompt action in clearing a dyke in his ownership. It was resolved that the parish council clear one village dyke and get a quotation to clear another dyke adjacent to the sports field.

I: Bench maintenance - following on from residents' complaints about the state of some of the benches in the village the clerk has obtained a quotation to repair/maintain these benches. It was resolved that the millennium bench be maintained immediately and that the funding to repair the other benches be applied for via the Rusholme trust funding.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS AND DECISIONS

To note application for an illuminated sign for McDonalds was approved.

To note application for biomass power plant at Tesco distribution centre was approved by ERYC.

ISSUES RAISED BY COUNCILLORS

Drainage at White City - Cllr Jackson alerted the councillors to present drainage problems at White City. The clerk will write to ERYC to assist in the drainage of properties still under council ownership and to write to the local drainage board to request dyke clearance to the rear of these properties.

Parking at White City - Cllr Jackson reported the regular use of the "lay by" in front of White City as a vehicle parking and toilet facility. The clerk will write to ERYC to ask for No Parking signs to be placed in this area to deter motorists from parking/stopping off in this area.

Traffic Calming near White City - Cllr Jackson informed of regular speeding motorists in this area and it being a high accident hot spot area. The clerk will write to ERYC highways to ask for double white lines to be placed in the centre of the road in this area to stop overtaking.

Paths Maintenance - White City - Cllr Jackson informed of the state of disrepair to the paths in this area. However, this should be remedied with the completion of the cycle path from Glews garage up to the roundabout with work due to start on September 19th. The council will monitor the area when works are completed.

Stiles on riverbank - Cllr Jackson

informed that it is impossible for dogs of a medium/large size to get through these stiles without being carried over by the owner. The clerk will write to ERYC to ask for these stiles to be adapted to allow all dogs a way to get through.

Phase 3 Drainage - Cllr Cowling has requested that a date be provided to establish when this work is to commence in the village. The clerk will action this.

Rabbits at Bracken Hill - Cllr Fox informed that her husband's ill health means he is unable to continue his role of rabbit control in this area. The clerk will issue Cllr Thurlow and Cllr Jackson with the appropriate shooting permits to continue this essential pest control.

APFA 5-year maintenance agreement - the clerk informed that this agreement is to expire in November 2011. It was decided that a new 5-year agreement be typed up and signed by both parties concerned with no changes to the current agreement being made.

The clerk informed of an invitation from Swinefleet Parish Council with councillors from Airmyn to meet up and discuss the possibility of a merger for the clerk's pension. The clerk is to arrange a meeting with SPC/APC chairmen to discuss appropriate pension schemes and the required funding necessary from all concerned parties.
