New roles for parish council

Airmyn Parish Council has become the sole corporate trustee of Airmyn Memorial Hall and Airmyn Playing Field.

The Charities Commission has appointed Airmyn Parish Council as the sole corporate trustee of both Airmyn Memorial Hall Trust and Airmyn Playing Field Trust. In the role of trustee, the parish council is in the process of appointing a new parish clerk and an administrator for both charities. The new parish clerk

will take on both roles but it must be stressed that in doing so, the clerk will act for each body independently: no regard shall be given to the views of the parish council when dealing with the charities and vice versa. The Airmyn Memorial Hall and Airmyn Playing Field Trusts are to be administered as separate entities.

Much work has been completed behind the scenes to enable this transfer to happen and a new contact telephone number and e-mail address will be issued once the clerk/administrator is in place. The programme of activities taking place on the playing field and in the hall will continue as normal.

The job of Manager/caretaker will be advertised in due course. The person appointed will undertake the day-to-day running of the hall and field; duties will include opening and closing the hall, setting up for special occasions, cleaning, health and safety checks both for the hall and field and clearing litter from the field and car park.

Airmyn Parish Council would welcome anyone who wishes to become involved with the charities, as members of the management committees or as volunteers to help with practical tasks.

On behalf of the community, the parish

council wishes to thank all those involved with both charities for their hard work and enthusiasm in running, maintaining and fund-raising for these two superb amenities. It has been a particularly difficult task over recent years with the lack of volunteers, and lesser mortals would have given up.

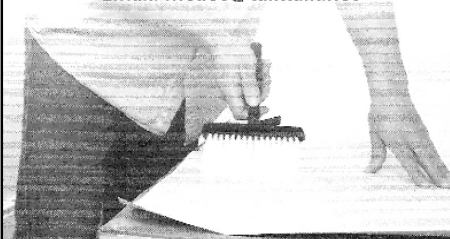

White Elephant stall raises £350 for church funds

I am writing on behalf of all the members of the Parochial Church Council to express our sincere thanks and appreciation to everyone reading this newsletter who contributed to the success of our White Elephant stall at the Table Top Sale in the Memorial Hall on Sunday 19th September.

There were lots of high-quality items generously donated for the stall by a great many different people and we had plenty of customers who turned out on the day to see what we had. I'm sure that many of them went away well pleased that they had picked up a bargain. We also had a good team of volunteers running the stall so that made the job more enjoyable. A final total of £349 was raised and all of this money will be applied towards helping to pay for the new gas central heating system which we hope

will be installed in the church at some time during October. Over £3,000 has now been raised so far by special initiatives such as this one to help to pay for the new heating and we are hoping also to make a successful application for a grant from the Diocese of Sheffield's Church in Action Fund.

In the meantime, the White Elephant Stall will be reborn for the Table Top Sale in the Hall that is to be held on Sunday, 17th October from 9am until midday. We had so much "good stuff" donated that we could not possibly sell it all on the day and we are therefore going to display what is left once again on the 17th. Many items are either unused or hardly used and will represent really good value to any purchaser.

Parish council latest

Extracts from the minutes of a meeting held on Wednesday 11 August 2010:

PROVISION OF ALLOTMENTS

This issue arose from the clerk's report, which had been circulated previously. It was noted that the availability of land continued to hamper the process of providing allotments in the village. It was resolved to write to make investigations on the status of land at the rear of Tofts Farm.

AIRMYN PLAYING FIELD CHARITY TRUSTEESHIP

The clerk reported that the Charity Commission had asked the current trustees to amend the constitution to suit sole corporate trusteeship of the parish council. A draft was considered by council. It was resolved that the council had no objections to the draft constitution prepared by APFA.

The clerk reported that the trustees had requested assistance with organising football pitch marking and that this was being done. The clerk felt that as the takeover of the APFA was imminent, it would be sensible for the council to meet with the current trustees to discuss requirements etc.

AIRMYN MEMORIAL HALL CHARITY TRUSTEESHIP

The clerk reported that the Charity Commission had sealed the transfer order on 9 August and that the parish council was now the sole corporate trustee of the hall. Members expressed their satisfaction at the smooth way in which the process had been dealt with by all concerned.

RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE TRUSTEESHIP COMMITTEE

The council was asked to consider a range of recommendations from the Trusteeship Committee which met on 28 July 2010. The following provisions were agreed:

General management of the charities - it was resolved that two completely separate committees are appointed to manage the

charities which will also include some non councillors in a voting capacity.

Airmyn Memorial Hall - it was resolved that committee membership will comprise the chairman of the parish council in ex-officio capacity; 3 x parish councillors; 2 x existing hall committee members; 1 x bowls association member; 1 x football users member and 1 x member from another user group. It was resolved that a team of volunteers is also recruited to assist with manual and other tasks in the hall.

Airmyn Playing Field Association - it was resolved that committee membership will comprise the chairman of the parish council in ex-officio capacity; 2 x parish councillors; 1 x bowls association members; 1 x football users member, 1 x Airmyn school member; people of the existing committee that are interested in continuing and 1 x parishioner. It was resolved that a team of volunteers is also recruited to assist with manual and other tasks in the hall.

Council and Charity administration - it was resolved to approve the recommendation for the appointment of a clerk/administrative officer for 50 hours per month (30 parish council hours, 20 charity hours) on scale LC1, point 23 to 25 (£20,198 to £21,519). It was also resolved to approve the recommendation for the appointment of a manager/caretaker at a rate of £7.50 per hour with hours worked being recorded by time sheet to meet the need for the job to be flexible.

It was further resolved that an Appointments Committee is created for the purposes of short listing, interviewing and making the appointment. Membership of the committee to comprise Councillors Thurlow, Spence and Bilton with the Clerk in attendance.

PARISH EMERGENCY PLAN

Cllr Cowling reported that she had used the East Riding of Yorkshire Council EP infor-

mation to research the establishment of a committee for the Parish Emergency Plan. Members were reminded that the council had resolved that all councillors would initially form the Plan Committee together with any parishioners who wished to be involved, of which there currently two persons are willing. It was resolved that the first meeting of the Emergency Plan Committee would take place in October.

PLANNING APPLICATION

The council considered an application for the redevelopment of a former farm for storage and distribution facilities with ancillary offices at Court House Farm Cottage, Rawcliffe Road, Airmyn. Great concern and dissatisfaction was expressed at the timescale given by the local planning authority for response to a major application in the parish.


It was resolved that the council strongly objects to the application on the grounds that it is contrary to numerous planning policies. It was also resolved that an extension to the consideration time is sought by the council.

VACANT PLOT, BEECH AVENUE

Councillor Cowling raised an issue requested by a parishioner regarding the unkempt state of the vacant plot on Beech Avenue. Councillor Fox agreed that she would try to assist the adjacent residents in this issue.
