The following fundraising ideas were discussed and F&F would love to hear your feedback. These events will only be a success if pupils and families support them.

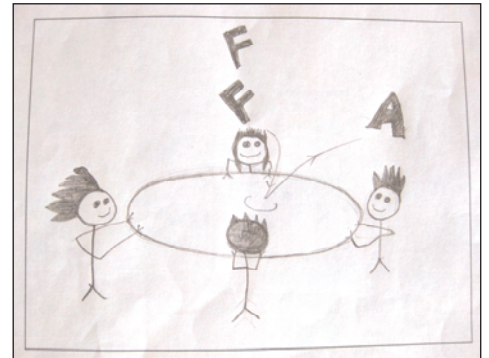
- Lottery/100 club

Allotments plans put on hold

Unfortunately the possibility of having an allotment area in the village of Airmyn has had to be put on hold for the foreseeable future.

At a recent meeting of the Memorial Hall and Playing Field committees the rules, regulations and costs to set up an allotment scheme were discussed at length.

The committees heard that essential requirements were water pipes, taps and troughs along with adequate fencing, bor-

ders, pathways and haulage ways. Also needed were gates, locks, skips and bins.

After much discussion it was decided that the costs to set up such a venture were too great, especially when an approximate annual rent of £35 per allotment per year would be the only income, meaning that initial and ongoing costs could never be recouped.

It was unanimously decided that such a scheme was not financially viable and so it was reluctantly abandoned.

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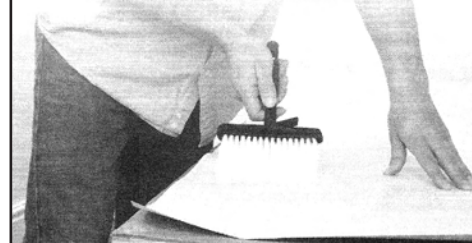

Parish council latest

Extracts from the minutes of a meeting held on Wednesday 10 August 2011:

BRIDLE PATH

The council decided to attend to the complaint from Mr Hussey as first item on the agenda.

Mr Hussey complains that a bridle path in the village is in need of maintenance due to overhanging trees and overgrown weeds creating a danger, obstruction and nuisance to pedestrians.

The council have agreed to contact the landowner to ask for trees to be cut back and pruned and will speak to the local paths contractor to maintain the full bridle path as soon as possible.

Mr Hussey was thanked for bringing this matter to the council's attention and left the meeting after his discussion and will be updated by the clerk of outcomes as they occur.

CLERK'S REPORT ON ONGOING ISSUES

A: Former school house condition. The clerk reported that Steven Devey from ERYC will now attend the September parish council meeting to explain and update ERYC actions so far. It was resolved that the parish council welcome the visit from Mr Devey and can discuss concerns with him on this date.

B: Village entrance sign - Cllr Fox informed the councillors that Alex Wells from ERYC is unable to attend the next few parish council meetings but will assist with the sign design if required. It was resolved that metal signs designs will be looked into possibly incorporating the clock tower image and the Percy family coat of arms image also.

C: Unadopted roads - the clerk reported part completing a "public rights of way" adoption form to begin proceedings to make a certain bridle path officially a public right of way. This has now been passed onto Cllr Watson to check the form and make additions to it where applicable. It was resolved that the clerk will await the completed form to be returned and then send off to ERYC. Cllr Fox also informed the council of a recent meeting with residents from Beech Grove/Close who are wanting to obtain funding to maintain the existing access roads to their premises.

D: Motorway noise - The clerk wrote to Highways Agency with a suggestion of possible tree screening to allay the noise from the M62, however a reply from them stated that tree planting on such a

narrow strip of land would not allay noise levels which in their opinion were not of a cause-for-concern level and as such are not high priority. It was resolved that Cllr Cowling discusses this issue at the meeting with ERYC Michael Brown on August 26 when a tree survey in Airmyn was to take place and report back any suggestions.

E: The grass cutting areas in the village were discussed with a map provided of areas cut by ERYC and it does appear some areas are cut twice in error. It was resolved that the clerk will contact ERYC to obtain amounts of cuts/litter picks and contract details.

Other items discussed, finalised and approved by the council:

That the financial internal audit be done in August with Cllr Dungay and Jackson at a date t.b.a.

That the insurance premiums for the hall and field will now be paid for by the parish council in the form of a grant of similar amount to be allocated to each charity committee when premiums due.

That the APFA constitution states that the field can be used for any recreational activities and so using a small part of the field for allotment purposes did not contravene the constitution in any way.

That the tree survey would be on August 26 with Cllr Cowling and Michael Brown.

That the parish plan is now complete and accounts closed with remaining balance paid to parish council account. Special thanks go to Cllrs Cowling and Dungay for the work involved.

That the clerk will take any items belonging to the parish council from Hinchcliffes shed and place the items in the Memorial hall storage container.

That the hall/field committee should now prepare a list of items to apply for from the Rusholme trust when or before funding becomes available.

That Cllr Cowling is given permission to purchase 3 storage containers and identified emergency items to be placed in them in case of a village emergency and funding for this will be obtained from parish council funds.

Bank accounts - following on from a request from Cllr Watson to move excess funds to a higher interest account, the clerk obtained figures from Halifax and Lloyds TSB. The interest rates were not comparable to existing accounts so it was decided to keep the accounts as they are for the future.

Wildlife survey - the clerk has obtained information from RSPB stating that any past bird surveys in our area are only collated as a county; not directly to each village area. To obtain information on birds currently in Yorkshire would cost £80 and any future surveys would be £500-plus. It was resolved that the council cannot allocate funds to this project at the moment.

That Cllr Fox collects the donated oak tree from Mr Gunson and locates a prime place for the parish council to plant it (possibly opposite the home of Dave Galloway).

PLANNING APPLICATIONS AND DECISIONS

To note application received for an illuminated sign for McDonalds. The councillors voted to object to this application on the grounds of it being unnecessary and will diminish the rural feel of the area and may cause confusion and hesitancy to passing motorists on a busy road.

ISSUES RAISED BY COUNCILLORS

BT Shed - Cllr Fox alerted the councillors to children playing in this shed. The police have been informed and will keep an eye on the area in question.

Cllr Thurlow had informed of an incident in Church View where a resident has fallen over an area of uneven paving. The clerk has informed ERYC Highways and received a response informing of

repair work to be performed shortly to the area in question.

Cllr Cowling informed the councillors that North Airmyn Grange was still

home to many buses and that pallet storage piles were unusually high and that as yet no landscaping work has begun. The clerk will contact ERYC enforcement officers to ask for an update on the situation to date.

Cllr Fox has received complaints from residents whose homes flooded from the recent bad storms. ERYC are to visit the areas concerned to establish the reason for the water not draining away adequately. The clerk received a reply from ERYC stating that the gullies on High Street were working correctly and had only been replaced in September 2010 but would be inspected in the near future.

Cllr Peake informed of sightings of a man wearing camouflage carrying a gun leaving Bracken Hill. It appears a few people have reported sightings of this man and the police will be informed.

ISSUES ARISING FROM NEW CORRESPONDENCE

The clerk informed of a verbal report from Mrs Spence regarding the state of disrepair to the village millennium bench. The councillors have instructed

the clerk to obtain quotations to rub down and re stain this bench and the two benches near the church and to obtain quotations to do the same repair work to the river bank benches and/or to replace the wood on these benches if needed.

The clerk informed of an invitation from Swinefleet Parish Council with councillors from Airmyn to meet up and discuss the possibility of a merger for the clerk's pension. The clerk is to arrange a meeting with SPC and to obtain pension details and quotations and to seek financial advice from accountants as to which pension is suitable.
